Forestry Overview

We have a forestry crew made of members from both streets and parks. It generally consists of a 5-6 person crew depending on the project size. Emerald Ash borer management still takes up a large percentage of our work load but this will decrease significantly in the next couple of years. This last year we treated roughly 300 Ash trees for EAB and will treat again in 2023. We took down the majority of remaining untreated diseased Ash trees in 2020. At this point we will have a small amount of Ash trees to take down in a few parks but this should be near complete by the end of 2021. For the first time we were able to use some of our own nursery. We had two phases of planting this year, one in spring and one in fall. This allows us to compensate for road construction projects to be completed.

Moving forward we will be focusing mainly on pruning, paying special attention to structural pruning on young trees. We will also be updating our entire forest canopy inspecting the trees for overall health, risk management and species composition.

This is a breakdown of 2020 followed by pictures of the work detail:

- Removed 400+ trees throughout city streets and parks.
- Planted 520 trees comprised of mainly bareroot with some container and B&B trees.
- Clearance pruned roughly 2000 street trees to clear for plow trucks and street sweepers.
- Decorated numerous downtown trees with lights for the holiday season.

Parks Overview

There are 34 designated parks within the city covering roughly 160 acres. The topography of the parks ranges from low lying wetlands to very hilly and the main soil composition is heavy clay. The majority of this acreage is actively maintained by our staff although some areas are left natural and unmanaged. Our staff consisted of one Superintendent, two full time maintenance staff and 10 seasonal. During the growing season much of the seasonal staff time is dedicated to daily maintenance of ball fields, mowing, bed maintenance and preparing for facility rentals. This allows for our full time crew to focus on more involved projects involving carpentry, electrical, masonry and repairs. We often reach out to volunteer groups and try to involve local school group but given the current status of our world this was not an option.

Moving forward into 2021 we will be expanding our seasonal staff to 12. We will be taking over the landscaping of the library along with the fire department. We have also been expanding our perennial garden beds throughout the city including a large prairie at coal dock park near the boardwalk. We have several projects planned for this upcoming year including:

- landscaping at the pool
- Hill School building renovations
- new baseball field
- skate park renovations
- new basketball and pickleball courts
