The 2019 boating season started out with bad weather during the months of April, May, and June which lead to a drop in season launch pass and transient activity. The last week in June saw a change in the weather for the Great lakes Sport Fishermen Derby and by the 4th of July business picked up to where it normally is for that time of year. However, fishing remained slow for most of the summer.

2019 saw the Marina facing many challenges. In November of 2018, a strong easterly storm broke up the floating piers place along the Blue Bridge. The insurance company granted the Marina \$29,633.94 for the damage. We were able to repair several of the piers during January, February, and March of 2019 at a cost of just \$3,302. The piers were then reinstalled by the Blue Bridge.

On March 1st it was discovered that water was leaking into our underground gasoline storage tank through a broken vent pipe and the 5600 gallons of gasoline stored in the tank had been contaminated. The repair to the storage tank, removal and loss of fuel cost the marina \$24,694.60.

In the beginning of June, with the rising lake levels, it became necessary to weld two feet of steel pipe to every piling in the Main Marina at a cost of \$39,633. Later in June we had to replace several surge protectors on the Marina's electrical system at a cost of \$4,485.09. And to top it off, in July the water heater for the tenant showers and restrooms quick working and needed to be replaced at a cost of \$8,437.

Despite these unexpected expenses, and thanks in part to the Marina's 100% occupancy rate and healthy transient traffic, the Marina was able to show a slight surplus for the year.
