SUBJECT: 2018 ANNUAL REPORT

The Annual Report for the City of Port Washington Police Department covering the period of January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018 is hereby submitted for your review.

We had many accomplishments in 2018 that are documented throughout this report. To highlight a few;

- As a result of a successful investigation into the downtown attempted carjacking and shooting of an 18-year-old Port Washington resident in May, the shooter and his accomplice were sentenced to 18 and 6 years in prison respectively.
- Officers Becker and Kuck attended Crisis Intervention Training (CIT), adding to our list of officers trained in CIT. CIT is police-based training to help persons with mental health disorders and/or addictions access medical treatment rather than place them in the criminal justice systems or escalate the situation.
- Officer Hurda attended the Basic Investigations of Computers and Electronics Crimes program put on by the Secret Service as well as attending a Cellbrite Reader course, Facebook for Law Enforcement, and the Wisconsin Association of Computer Crime Investigators (WACCI) Conference.
- Officer T. Russell attended Field Search Software training as well as the WACCI conference.
- Updated through training, our Evidence Tech Team, with Officers Erickson and Nye attending current Evidence Tech School.

A new 2018 Ford Interceptor SUV was purchased and converted to a bi-fuel vehicle. We also purchased a 2018 Chevrolet Traverse. We continue to benefit from fuel savings as a result of converting the new Interceptor vehicle to propane as well as gasoline.

The department has had at its disposal a Can-Am ATV loaned to the department for summer beach patrol by Cedar Creek Motor Sports.

In 2018, the Port Washington Lions Club generously donated funds for Green Bay Packer football cards for distribution to the children in the community. The Packer football card program continues to be very popular with the children. WE also offered several "Ride to School in a Patrol Car" certificates for various fundraising events.


We continue to update our Accreditation files to keep them in compliance with the accreditation standards. The Port Washington Police Dept. was initially accredited by the Wisconsin Law Enforcement Accreditation Group in July 2010. Re-accreditation took place in September 2013 and again in September 2016. 2019 will be a re-accreditation year with re-accreditation scheduled for September $10^{th} - 12^{th}$.

In August, Officer Gary Belzer had a successful liver transplant and was unable to work for the remainder of 2018. In November Officer Vitella was called up for active duty with the Army Reserve.

I am grateful for the cooperation and support the Commission has given me and the trust and confidence you have placed in this department and its officers.





The Port Washington Police Department's Honor Guard is composed of eight volunteers who are highly motivated and maintain high standards of appearance and conduct. The purpose of the Honor Guard is to honor and support fallen members of law enforcement, providing funeral honors for fallen officers.

The Port Washington Police Department Honor Guard had the duty of providing police funeral honors for Officers Charles Irvine and Michael Michalski of the Milwaukee Police Department. Honor Guard members also held a benefit day at Tello's Restaurant for the Adam Hartwig Scholarship Foundation, raising nearly \$1,200. In May, Honor guard Members Jerry Nye and Jim Russell represented the PWPD at National Police Memorial Week in Washington, DC. This event honors those officers that have paid the ultimate sacrifice.





BICYCLE PATROL UNIT

The Port Washington Police Department has four mountain bicycles that are used to patrol the city's streets, parks, bike trails, and during special events, including Fish Day and Race the Harbor bike race.

The PWPD utilizes the bike patrol for better interaction with the community, better mobility at festivals, and on bike trails as well as a quieter, almost stealth-like presence useful in detecting illegal activity.

The Bike Patrol Unit is comprised of Officers Moertl, Bergin, Nye, and J. Russell. Several reserve officers have also been trained and participate in the bike patrol program.



MOTORCYCLE UNIT

The Port Washington Police Department currently operates a 2007 Harley-Davidson motorcycle.

The motorcycle unit is currently staffed by Officer Dan Wolff whose primary duties include traffic enforcement, escort duties for funerals and other special assignments, such as National Night Out and our annual Open House.

Officer Wolff has undergone extensive training in the operation of our police motorcycle with annual refresher training.



SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER


For the last several years, we have had Officer Bergin assigned to the Port Washington Schools as the part-time School Resource Office. Officer Bergin gives talks and presentations to the students at all four school as well as working patrol.

Officer Bergin is involved in a number of school-sponsored functions and events and spends a significant amount of time working with school administration and students on truancy issues.



ELECTRONIC CRIMES UNIT

Technology has changed our world, including how officers work to solve crimes. Because of the steadily increasing number of calls for service regarding online investigations involving digital evidence, we have invested heavily in training and computer equipment. This has included training at the National Computer Forensics Institute in Alabama, Geocell Advanced Cell Phone Investigations training in Minnesota, as well as other classes and online training.



DRUG RECOGNITION EXPERTS

In response to the escalating drug trends, the department had two officers trained to become Drug Recognition Experts (DRE) in 2014 and 2015. DREs are trained to recognize impairment due to drugs, primarily for enforcement of those operating while under the influence of substances other than alcohol.

Officers undergo four weeks of classroom and practical certification to complete training and become a DRE.

Our DREs are utilized by our department, as well as other Law Enforcement Agencies in the area to evaluate these drug impaired drivers. In 2018 our DREs evaluated 17 suspected drug impaired drivers.

Safety Town

Safety Town is held every June at Dunwiddie Elementary School. It is a two-week program for children who will be entering kindergarten in the fall. It is sponsored by the Port Washington Kiwanis Club, with support from the Port Washington Police Department and Saukville Police Department.

Students learn about safety by riding small cars through the streets of a miniature town constructed on the playground. Further instruction is enhanced by visits from the Port Washington Fire Department, McGruff, a Wisconsin State Trooper, and other guests and speakers. The children will also take a short field trip on a bus to learn about bus safety and water safety.







National Night Out
