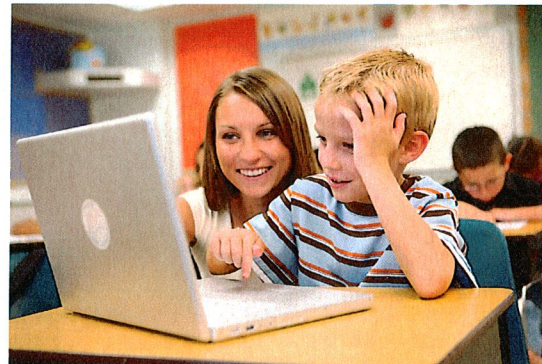

Academic Achievement

We hold high expectations for our students and staff members as we again score above the state average in all standardized tests, including the ACT. Also, our three elementary schools, the middle school, and the high school exceeded expectations on the state-wide report card. We offer 14 advanced placement (AP) courses at the high school for college credit. We have 57 AP scholars, and one student who had the highest score possible on five advanced placement tests, resulting in the National Scholar recognition.
