
Mission Statement

PARKS OVERVIEW

We actively manage 32 designated parks, 2 nature preserves, several municipal buildings and one cemetery covering roughly 160 acres. There are several other open space areas that are not actively managed but will require maintenance at times for safety and other factors. During the spring and summer season much of our efforts are dedicated to turf maintenance, facility rental preparation, plant bed maintenance, planting, and watering. We work with several volunteers, partner with organizations, and reach out for other funding sources to aid us in projects.



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FORESTRY OVERVIEW

Our forestry crew is made up of members from the DPW street department and parks department. It generally consists of a 3-5 person crew. We manage street trees along with park trees as a joint effort. There are approximately 10,000 street trees made up of over 60 varieties. We continue to increase the diversity in our urban forest throughout the parks and streets. This past summer we were able to update our entire forest inventory into GIS with the use of a grant awarded by the DNR. Our focus for the past 10 years had been EAB management focusing on removing trees with an unacceptable risk level. We have now shifted to pruning for vehicle clearance and structural pruning our younger 10-15 year old trees. On average we plant roughly 300-400 trees per year.
