OZAUKEE COUNTY **Bratt Woods Natural Area**

HIKE LOCATIONS

Located along the Milwaukee River in the Town of Grafton, WI, Bratt Woods is 17 acres. In addition to bordering the Milwaukee River this preserve contains mature oak, maple, and American beech trees all in gorgeous upland hardwood forests.

Cedarburg Bog State Natural Area

Cedarburg Bog is the most intact large bog in southeastern Wisconsin and composed of a mosaic of vegetation types. Once part of a large glacial lake, the bog is a relict community a southern example of the type more commonly found in northern Wisconsin. There are six lakes remaining within the bog, all with varying sizes and depths.

Cedarburg Environmental Study Area

Located in the Town of Cedarburg, WI, CESA is 38 acres. This preserve contains wetlands, ponds, open meadow, conifer forests and mixed hardwood forests. Additionally, walking through the preserve you will see unique insects, birds, mammals, amphibians, reptiles, and an amazing array of ant hills.

Forest Beach Migratory Preserve

Located along Lake Michigan in the town of Belgium, WI, Forest Beach Migratory Preserve is 116 acres. This preserve contains a 5-acre hardwood forest with ephemeral (seasonal) ponds, open grassland and prairie, a partially wooded ravine and 5 constructed wetland ponds.

Harrington Beach State Park

Harrington Beach State Park has more than a mile of beach along Lake Michigan. This 715-acre park also features a white cedar and hardwood swamp, old field grasslands with restored wetland ponds and a scenic limestone quarry lake.

Highland Woods

The 84 acre natural area is a premier example of high quality old growth forest and an important wildlife corridor in the Pigeon Creek floodplain.

OZAUKEE COUNTY

Sauk Creek Nature Preserve

Located in Port Washington, WI, the Sauk Creek Nature Preserve is 27 acres. The creek runs north and south over limestone bedrock ledges and eventually flows into Lake Michigan. Floodplain forest runs along Sauk Creek and a series of wetland/spring seeps discharge water into the creek.

WASHINGTON COUNTY

Cedar Lake/Polk Kames Segment

Part of the <u>Ice Age National Scenic Trail</u> system, it is variously referred to as the Cedar Lakes Segment and Polk Kames. The trail winds through a mixed forest made of old oaks, sugar maple, white birch and beech. In the interior is 0.8-mile white-blazed Kame Loop trail, which curves around a prominent kame.

Hepburn Woods

Located in the City of West Bend, WI, Hepburn Woods is 20 acres. This preserve contains wooded hills and is home to wild turkey, white-tailed deer and hosts a tremendous variety of migratory songbirds.

Ice Age Trail - Milwaukee River Segment

The Washington County Milwaukee River Segment of the Ice Age Trail runs for 6.8-miles between the Kewaskum Segment and the Fond du Lac County line near New Fane. This segment is a blend of open prairie and shaded woodlands.

Lac Lawrann Conservancy

Lac Lawrann Conservancy is a 145 acres nature preserve and is contiguous with Royal Oaks park adding another 25 acres. It is a vast expanse of water, sky, wetlands, native hardwood forest, red pine plantation, tall grass prairie, and glacial landscapes. The Conservancy serves as refuge to over 300 species of plants, over 200 species of birds, and a wide variety of mammals as well as reptiles and amphibians.









WASHINGTON COUNTY

Schoen Laufen Park

Schoen Laufen (Beautiful Walk) Park is 39 acres and is considered Germantown's first environmental park. The park is located along the Menomonee River at the corners of Maple Road and Lilac Lane. A trail winds through a beech / maple forest with a great display of spring ephemerals

SHEBOYGAN COUNTY

Gerber Lake Wildlife Area

The 153-acre Gerber Lake Wildlife Area boasts pristine natural beauty. Hilly terrain, two small lakes adjoined by a channel, forest, and prairie make this property truly exceptional.

Maywood Environmental Park

The land now known as Maywood was gifted to the City of Sheboygan in 1973 by Mr. and Mrs. Ellwood H. May who owned Mayline Furniture in Sheboygan. Over the years additional acreage was added to the park to provide the 135-acres the community enjoys today. Maywood Environmental Park is open to the public year-round and offers environmental education opportunities, outdoor recreation, and hands-on experiences.

FOND DU LAC COUNTY

Hobbs Woods

Located about three miles south of Fond du Lac at N4145 Hickory Rd., Hobbs Woods is a 60-acre county park devoted to hiking and nature study.









Milwaukee County

Seven Bridges Trail in Grant Park

Trails are unpaved and lannon stone paths, lannon stone staircases, and numerous foot bridges, visit during any season to see carpets of spring wildflowers, hear the songs of migratory birds, fabulous fall colors, the refreshing sound of water rushing in a brook. Following the trails, you'll be led among enormous trees such as the native beech, along creeks, into secluded areas, and onto the shore of Lake Michigan. Please exercise caution on the trail—especially after heavy rainfall!

Lakeshore State Park

In the heart of downtown Milwaukee, Lakeshore State Park is adjacent to the Henry W. Maier Festival Grounds and Discovery World at Pier Wisconsin. The park is an urban oasis offering a small beach and accessible paved trails that link to Milwaukee's other lakefront parks and the Hank Aaron State Trail.

Kenosha County

Bristol Woods

Bristol Woods Park is the most natural of all the Kenosha County Parks. This 200-acre park boasts 4.28 miles of hiking trails and is home to the weekly concert series Bristol Woodstock.

Petrifying Springs Park

Petrifying Springs Park is the flagship of Kenosha County Parks. Known to locals as "Pets," this park is the oldest in the system and offers a wide range of enjoyment for people of all ages throughout the year.



SAUK COUNTY

Devil's Lake State Park

Situated along the Ice Age National Scenic Trail, Devil's Lake State Park offers magnificent views from 500-foot quartzite bluffs overlooking a 360-acre lake. Visitors enjoy nearly 30 miles of hiking trails, lakeshore picnic areas, swimming beaches, paddling opportunities, and year-round naturalist programs.

ROCK COUNTY

Carver-Roehl Park

This 53-acre park is Rock County's second oldest park and one of the most scenic. The park, including the Carvers Rock site, was acquired in 1950 from the Roehl family. The area had been discussed as a County park since the mid 1920s. Spring Brook Creek runs from north to south through the park, just north of its confluence with Turtle Creek.

DODGE COUNTY

Ledge Park

Ledge Park (83 acres) lies along the Niagara Escarpment, a natural rock ledge which divides the park into upper and lower areas and provides a breathtaking overlook of the famous Horicon Marsh and surrounding countryside.









BROWN COUNTY

Neshota Park

Located in the southeast corner of the County, where the Neshota River is joined by King Creek, providing 260 acres of riverbed, steeply sloped valleys, and wooded hills. Neshota Park is a gorgeous setting for the naturalist, sightseer, hiker, dog walker, cross country skier, horseback rider, family road trip and so many other users.

GREEN COUNTY

Sugar River State Recreation Trail

The Sugar River State Trail follows an abandoned railroad line in south central Wisconsin for 24 miles from New Glarus to Brodhead. A short access trail connects the Sugar River State Trail to New Glarus Woods State Park. Fourteen trestle bridges cross over the Sugar River and its tributaries, while the trail passes by farmlands, woods, rolling hills, and remnant prairies. The trail has also been designated as a National Recreational Trail.

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO!

Some of these parks and trails may require an admission fee! We advise that you plan ahead by checking online for admission fee information. It may be a good idea to bring along an extra \$10 just in case! Purchasing a Wisconsin State Park Vehicle Admission Sticker may save you some money if you plan on visiting a lot of State parks!




